Education & Teachers	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Diffit: article on a topic with sources, summary, vocabulary & questions.• MagicSchool.ai: lessons plans, assessments, misconceptions, rubrics• Magic To Do: Auto creates lists of tasks, re-writes text for tone• QuestionWell: Generates questions and discussion prompts• EduAide: Create lesson plans, resources, and assessments
Generative AI	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Bard: Sign up with a Google Account. Must be enabled by admin• ChatGPT: Sign up with a phone number and email address• Claude: Sign up with a Google Account, incorporates more data
Multimedia	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• DALL-E: images from textual descriptions using various artistic styles• Dream Studio: develop highly realistic images based on text prompts• Slides.AI.io: generates slides (headings, bullets, etc) from prompt• Curipod: students submit response to AI generated slides
Research & Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Elicit: surfaces academic papers based on research question.• Perplexity: Similar to ChatGPT but with sources cited.• Quillbot: assists with paraphrasing, synonyms, and re-wording• Canva Magic Write: Creates text based on prompt
AI Detectors	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• AI Content Detector: To gain more functions sign up for a free account.• Crossplag: Provides a score of likely plagiarism from 0-100.• GPTZero: Determines perplexity (complexity) & burstiness (randomness)• ZeroGPT: Highlights text suspected to be AI-generated.
